

Student Expectations

NO PARKING ON GRASS OR UPPER LESSON AREA

- **All students should aim to arrive at least 10 minutes before their lesson block**
- **Students should ready to start their lesson on time**
 - Students that prep/have their own horse should arrive at AV Equestrian 30-45 minutes early to brush,tack and be ready to warm up.
 - Lesson clocks start on the dot; early starts can happen.
- **Students are respectful to horses, coaches, spectators and other riders at all times**
- **Students are prepared with all required equipment**
- **Students are allowed breaks at any point during their lesson; water, bathroom, catch a breath etc.**
 - Note: time does not stop for breaks
- **Students are expected to be active listeners and maintain a safe environment for themselves and others while on property**
- **Students are prohibited from using cameras/videos during lessons without expressed permission from the coach.**
- **Students are not permitted to wander on property or enter/approach any pens/horses without expressed permission**
- **Students are expected to help/learn to groom and tack horses as a part of their lesson until they can safely reach independent horse prep.**
- **Students on lesson horses: Lesson horses are assigned for a number of reasons, I take suggestions about moving things around but it is not always possible. Please respect my attempt to give everyone the right horse!**

Spectator Expectations

NO PARKING ON GRASS OR UPPER LESSON AREA

I love having viewers at lessons; however, over the years additional kids (siblings, friends etc.) often become rowdy, loud and do not adhere to my expectations of remaining respectful while I am coaching.

I cannot parent, coach and babysit.

If additional viewers join to watch, I expect them to remain respectful. Failure to maintain a safe space may result in a removal from the program.

If you wish to play with them. Please ask first and respect my answers
(No matter how many sticks, toys or balls they bring you)

2. Absolutely NO running, yelling or rowdy play anywhere on the lesson area
3. No touching, petting or interacting with any horses. Please only use your eyes
4. No sideline coaching
5. Please keep all viewing parties under 5 people (Group lessons, under 3)
6. No outside dogs on the property - if unavoidable they must remain the vehicle
7. We have cats, and they are friendly. Please don't chase them to catch them.

Student Checklist

1. ASTM Certified Riding helmet (regardless of age/ level)
2. Heeled riding boot - Paddock or cowgirl boots
 - a. Hiking boots are acceptable - mudboots are not.
3. Proper riding attire
 - a. No shorts or tank tops. Remove all dangle jewelry and tape/remove any stud jewelry on face (Ears excluded)
4. Recommended to have a jacket/hoodie in case weather shifts
5. Water bottle and a snack is always recommended

Competitive riding student additional

1. Students in competitive program must have valid HCBC membership
2. Hair should be tied back/braided or in a net
3. Competitive riding students are expected to have lesson attire reflective of their commitment
 - a. Western riders: Jeans with no rips
 - b. English riders: Leggings/breeches (any colour)
 - i. No Cargo, sweat or other styles are acceptable.
